

March 5, 2019 Community Day/Events Meeting

Chairman Daubenspeck opened the Community Day/Events meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Community Center.

Egg Hunt:

Chairman Daubenspeck announced the Egg Hunt would be held at 10:00 a.m. and we should be done everything by noon. Tiffany, from Town Hall, was trying to order the eggs. He would contact Charlie Bosco at Public Works regarding cleaning up the area for the Egg Hunt. He added that Darlene Perna would be taking care of the crafts.

Mr. Deegan reported that the Police Department was taking over the Municipal Alliance program. They would like to have a table to collect unused medications. They will advertise the collection and the Egg Hunt on their events schedule. They also wanted to have a table at opening day for Little League and other recreational events.

Sr. Citizens:

Chairman Daubenspeck questioned if they would fund the Sr. Citizens' Christmas Party again this year.

Mr. Deegan replied yes and they might also do a picnic for them this summer. He also reported that the Sr. Citizens' lunch program has been having about 40 people for lunch, the last meeting they had 47 attend.

Chairman Daubenspeck stated that the Recreation Commission members had talked about having an event for the Sr. Citizens.

Mr. Deegan stated it would be good to do something for them after school or when school is done for the summer.

Community Day:

Chairman Daubenspeck stated he would work with Mr. Deegan regarding donations. He noted that he didn't think anyone missed the ad book and all the extra work it created.

Mr. Simkins stated he didn't get any comments on the matter.

Chairman Daubenspeck stated that the paper work was prepared for the coin drop on June 21 & 22. Last year we made approximately \$2,800, and we could only cover the one intersection.

Mr. Deegan noted that the Fire Company made about \$5,300.00 covering the 2 interesections for Friday evening and Saturday morning. Both Mr. Deegan and Chairman Daubenspeck stated they had the required vest for the coin drop.

The hours of the drop will be 4:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. on Friday June 21<sup>st</sup> and 8:00 a.m. until noon on Saturday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Mr. Simkins reported he was working on the signs and they would also be available if the Fire Company or any other organization wanted to use them.

Chairman Daubenspeck reported he had reached out to Dave Cornwell for Community Day, but has not heard back from him to date. He discussed possible headliner bands: Slippery When Wet, Draw The Line-Arrow Smith music, Fad Faux-Beatles music, Rain-Beatles Music, and a Queen type band.

Members agreed to have the Monster truck return and also the Dance Party.

Mrs. Neely suggested a K-9 demonstration now that Franklin Township has 3 K-9 dogs.

Mr. Lucas will drive the tractor and run the hay ride again.

The Community Day/Events meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
